
When the SMS text Comes Through: Nursing the Patient on Sacituzumab Govitecan (Trodelvy®) in mTNBC

What does *real-world* nursing care look like when a patient starts on an antibody–drug conjugate like sacituzumab govitecan? How do you explain a treatment that behaves differently to traditional chemotherapy? And what’s the best response when your phone buzzes with a patient message about a new or worrying symptom?

In this interactive, case-led session, experienced oncology nurse **Samantha Moules** will walk through the lived reality of caring for a patient with metastatic triple-negative breast cancer commencing sacituzumab govitecan. Using a single patient journey as the anchor, Samantha will share practical tips, clinical judgement, and communication strategies drawn from everyday nursing practice.

Key questions explored include:

- How do we educate patients about Trodelvy® in a way that makes sense and sets realistic expectations?
- What should guide our response when a patient texts or calls about side effects outside the clinic?
- How do we help patients understand whether treatment is “working” when scans, symptoms, and timelines don’t always align?
- What matters most to patients—and how can nurses confidently address those concerns?

Designed to be conversational, interactive, and highly practical, this session puts the nurse–patient relationship at the centre of care. Attendees will leave with actionable insights, language they can use tomorrow in clinic, and renewed confidence in supporting patients receiving ADC therapies.
